- Ontario Legislation Bill 132 sexual violence policy and procedure
- Continuum of behaviour
- Point person for student disclosures of sexual violence
- Foster collaboration across department and resources to provide the best support possible for student survivors of sexual violence

Sexual Violence Policy

- Applies to all university community members
- Alleged behaviour <u>materially affects</u> the safety of a university community member and is related to:
 - The university's learning environment
 - The university as a workplace
 - Regardless of where the alleged behaviour took place

Policy is on the Sexual Violence Support and Information website



Disclosure vs. Formal Complaint

Disclosure

- Student is looking for supports related to safety and academics
- Does not trigger any Resolution Process
- No action will be taken against a Person Accused

Formal Complaint

- Written complaint through Diversity & Human Rights
- Opportunity for Mediation
- Interim measures for safety.
- Investigation
- Finding based on a Balance of Probabilities
- Report to VP Student Affairs with finding and suggested penalty
- Appeal process

^{*}exceptions for safety interest

Penalties

If the person accused is found responsible under the Policy. Penalties may include:

Warning

Non academic Probation

Forbid Entry to Certain Premises

Restriction of Computing Privileges

Community Service or Educational Program

Restricted Access to non-academic events or programs

Recommendation for suspension or expulsion



Fall 2017 and Winter 2018

- **Disclosures** to SV Support Services = 82* (does not include disclosures to other units)
- Meetings to support students = 245
- Historical, while at university or a combination of both
- Formal Complaints to DHR = 6
- Student survivors can chose to use more than one formal proceeding e.g. criminal and/or professional hearing

Survivor Supports

- Be treated with compassion, dignity and respect
- Information about university support services and community resources
- Disclosing and reporting options and the limits to confidentiality associated with each option
- Provided with appropriate academic consideration and other supports based on demonstrated need
- Formulate a personal safety plan



- Whether to engage in Resolution processes including filing a Formal Complaint
- Whether to access university support services and to choose the services they will be the most beneficial

*unless there are safety concerns for the university community

Support

- No two students/survivors are the same
- Many are first year student who do not know processes or how to get help/support
- Most are victimized by someone they know now who do they trust?
- May lack family and social support don't want to reveal what happened to family and friends
- May have other struggles that are compounded by this incident
- Many struggle with concerns for their safety
- May affect their ability to concentrate and memorize information which can impact their academic success

My Role

Truly dynamic role that leverages other services on and off campus to best support students impacted by sexual violence

In this past academic year, support was provided jointly with 25 departments/agencies on and off campus to support students

Disclosures for support, reporting options and safety plans

Provide information without having the person tell their story repeatedly. One stop shopping for information and referrals.

Student went to Student Counselling

Was referred to the SV Support Services

In-take meeting, risk assessment and safety plan

Helped relocate student from off campus to on campus (Housing)

Information about breaking lease (Off Campus Living)

Funds to support move (Student Financial Services)

Moved into student residence (Housing)

Temporary academic support (Student Accessibility Services)

Connected with Physician (Health Services)

Connected with Sexual Violence Care & Treatment Centre (GGH)

Example (in 2 days with only 2 points of contact for the student)

Academic Support



Extensions, deferred privileges, alternate examination, date/location



Appropriate academic consideration



39 students requested some form of academic support



My communication goes directly to Faculty/TA



Encourage student to reach out to Faculty/TA for support

Disclosure to You

- Understand that trauma will affect the way that a survivor will think, behave, cope, interact and react
- Believe the survivor don't ask blaming questions
- Be respectful of privacy and confidentiality
- **Provide** information/resources
- Ask them what supports they need safety/academic
- Let the survivor make their own decisions
- Respect the survivor's right to tell people at their own pace, or not to tell

Listen, Support and Refer

- Don't ask for details or question their choices
- Don't make them call the Police
- Empower them to make their own decision and to take control of their recovery
- Please feel free to refer student to my office. Other resources?
- What resources are available?



- You seem upset, is everything ok?
- I'm here if you want to talk
- What do you need? What kind of support do you need?
- Do you want to look at some resources together?
- I'm sorry this happened to you
- Thank you for telling/trusting me
- What can I do to help?


